Highlights: Use the 2021 CMAP to plan for and implement measures. The CMAP includes 33 greenhouse gas reduction strategies and 12 adaptation strategies to reduce emissions 40% below 1990 levels by 2030 and 80% below 1990 levels by 2050. The 45 strategies vary in size, complexity, cost,

implementation time, and scope.
